Ontario to end academic streaming, suspensions for youngest students

After years of calls from some educators and advocacy groups to end the practice, the Ontario government says it will do away with academic streaming in Grade 9.

Streaming - in which students must choose to pursue either an "academic" or "applied" track when they begin high school - has been shown to disproportionately affect Black and low-income students when it comes to graduation rates and the chance of going to post-secondary education.

Details of the province's decision were first published in the Toronto Star on Monday morning. In an exclusive interview with the newspaper, Education Minister Stephen Lecce called streaming a "systemic, racist, discriminatory" practice.

A spokesperson for the minister said that the full plan to eliminate streaming will be rolled out shortly, and it is expected to take effect by the 2021-2022 school year.

Ontario is one of the few places in Canada that continues to separate students into the hands-on applied stream and the post-secondary-track academic stream as they start high school.

A 2017 report led by York University professor Carl James found that Black teens in the Greater Toronto Area were being streamed into applied course tracks at significantly higher rates than other students.

Fifty-three per cent of Black students were in academic programs as compared to 81 per cent of white and 80 per cent of other so-called racialized students, meaning those who are part of other visible minorities. Conversely, 39 per cent of Black students were enrolled in applied programs, compared to 18 per cent of other racialized groups and 16 per cent of white students.

Meanwhile, a 2015 report from the group People for Education found that students taking applied courses in Grade 9 were much less likely to go to university and that students from low-income groups were more likely to enroll in applied courses.

The Toronto District School Board (TDSB), which began phasing out streamed courses in Grades 9 and 10 in recent years, previously found that only 40 per cent of students who took an applied course in Grade 9 graduated within five years.

Streaming ingrained into education culture, researcher says

John Malloy, director of education at the TDSB - Canada's largest school board - applauded the province's decision in a series of tweets. He called the change "necessary and complex" and said that it will require "much support and accountability" to ensure success for students.

Meanwhile, in an interview this morning, James said the change has been "a long time coming," noting that his own research and that of others has shown that biases about race and the socioeconomic backgrounds of students have had an outsized effect on how students are placed.

He added that parents are often unaware of the full consequences of streaming on their children's education and futures.

James also cautioned that streaming has been so ingrained in Ontario's secondary school system, it will take time and work to ensure it doesn't continue in more subtle ways.

"Since, culturally, there is the whole idea of streaming, we're going to have to have teachers - and students and parents, as well - start to rethink what it means to place students into a classroom where we're trying to capitalize on their abilities and strengths, and not be streamed into what teachers and others think are their abilities and strengths," he said.

Ontario's NDP, the Official Opposition, also tentatively lauded the news. NDP education critic Marit Stiles called the move "an important first step." She added that her party will be "watching closely for details" as the policy is rolled out.

Canada extends ban on foreign travellers to July 31

OTTAWA -- The Canadian government has extended the current ban on most international travellers until July 31.

The federal government first shut the border to non-Canadian citizens, with limited exceptions, to limit the spread of COVID-19 in mid-March. The extension on the foreign travel ban was made through a federal order recommended by Health Minister Patty Hajdu, dated June 29.

The ban allows permanent Canadian residents, the immediate family members of Canadian citizens, as well as diplomats and air crews, to come into Canada, though anyone who has symptoms of COVID-19 will still not be allowed to enter Canada.

"The introduction or spread of the disease would pose an imminent and severe risk to public health in Canada, the entry of persons into Canada who have recently been in a foreign country may introduce or contribute to the spread of the disease in Canada, and no reasonable alternatives to prevent the introduction or spread of the disease are available," reads the government's reasoning for the ongoing ban, in part.

This ban exempts the United States, which entered into a separate agreement with Canada shortly after the halt on all other foreign travel. The U.S. travel restrictions have been renewed until July 21 at least, meaning that all discretionary travel remains prohibited.

"To protect Canadians and to ease the potential burden non-essential travellers could place on our health care system and its frontline workers, the CBSA has implemented travel restrictions across all ports of entry in all modes of transportation... All travel of an optional or discretionary nature, including tourism and recreation, is covered by these measures," said Canada Border Services Agency spokesperson Rebecca Finlay in an email.

This decision to extend the ban comes after the European Union agreed to a set of recommendations that will allow travellers from other nations, including Canada, to visit EU countries. The United States did not make the list of approved countries.

Last week Global Affairs Canada issued a reminder to Canadians that despite some countries partially reopening their borders, the national advice remains to avoid all non-essential travel outside of the country.

The mandatory 14-day self-isolation for any non-essential worker entering Canada remains in effect, as do all other aspects of the Quarantine Act.

To help Canadians stuck abroad, the government offered travellers an emergency loan of up to \$5,000 to get home, and after chartering flights to repatriate stranded Canadians the department says the "final few" flights will be scheduled in the coming weeks, with no further trips planned.

China issues warning for citizens travelling to Canada

Last week, the Canadian government announced that it was suspending the Canada-Hong Kong extradition treaty in response to concerns over the passage of national security legislation for Hong Kong by the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress of China. Now, China has issued a travel warning against Canada for its citizens.

The warning was issued on Monday, according to a report from the South China Morning Post.

In a statement, the Chinese Embassy in Ottawa said it "urges" the Canadian side to "earnestly abide by international law and basic norms governing international relations, immediately correct its mistakes, stop meddling in China's internal affairs in any way, so as not to further damage China-Canada relations."

The embassy added that "Hong Kong is China's special administrative region" and that "Hong Kong affairs are entirely China's internal affairs and allow no foreign interference."

It stressed that Canada's "attempt to exert pressure on China under the pretext of Hong Kong-related issues is completely against the trend of time, and doomed to fail like kicking against the rocks."

In announcing the Canadian government's decision last week, Minister of Foreign Affairs Philippe Champagne said Canada "joins the international community in reiterating its serious concern at the passage of national security legislation for Hong Kong by the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress of China," said Champagne.

This legislation was enacted in a secretive process, without the participation of Hong Kong's legislature, judiciary or people, and in violation of international obligations.

How to design the Municipal Nominee Program

Canada will launch the Municipal Nominee Program to help promote economic development in smaller cities across Canada.

Following each federal election in Canada, the Prime Minister provides cabinet ministers with mandate letters to fulfill.

The mandate letters outline the priorities of each minister.

After Canada's October 2019 election, Marco Mendicino was appointed as immigration minister.

Launching a new Municipal Nominee Program (MNP) was among the priorities outlined to him by Prime Minister Justin Trudeau.

Prior to the coronavirus pandemic, Minister Mendicino said that Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) was in the early stages of consulting with the public on the MNP.

The pandemic has interrupted these plans but the MNP will eventually launch. Here are some early thoughts on what it could look like.

5,000 spots available per year

Minister's mandate letter calls for at least 5,000 immigration spots to be available under the MNP.

This strongly suggests that the MNP will launch as a pilot program, like other new IRCC programs rolled out in recent years.

If this is the case, IRCC could welcome up to 2,750 principal applicants under the pilot per year. The remaining 2,250 spots would be available for the spouses and dependents of principal applicants.

Selecting the municipalities The first major consideration of designing the program is identifying how IRCC can select participating municipalities.

This will be a challenging undertaking considering the number of municipalities that exist in Canada, most of which would benefit from higher immigration to support their economies.

To provide a sense of how difficult it will be to identify which municipalities should participate, consider that Canada had 35 census metropolitan areas (CMA) and 117 census agglomerations (CA) as of the 2016 Census.

Generally speaking, a CMA has a population of at least 100,000 people while a CA has a population below that but at least 10,000 people.

Many of these CMAs and CAs will welcome the opportunity to



participate under the MNP.

To narrow the field, IRCC may choose to exclude the Atlantic provinces, since they have the Atlantic Immigration Pilot, and communities that are participating in the Rural and Northern Immigration Pilot.

Existing federal programs and other economic class streams such as the Provincial Nominee Program (PNP) give us a strong sense of how to foster retention under the MNP.

Yes, candidates with a job offer should be prioritized. But even if a candidate does not have a job offer, they should still be selected so long as they demonstrate ties to the community. These ties can be demonstrated through the likes of completing post-secondary education in the municipality, obtaining post-graduation work experience there, and having family members there.

Of course, participating communities also need to do their part to foster retention. For instance, they need to support welcoming environments for newcomers within the municipality and also need to make settlement and integration supports available to immigrants who may need help after gaining permanent residence through the MNP.

Fortunately, there is plenty of success stories across Canada that MNP communities can learn from to foster their own success.

It remains to be seen when the MNP will formally launch, but we should hear more about it from IRCC in 2020.

At the same time, selection criteria need to screen for candidates that the communities will most likely be able to retain over the long run. Retention is key to achieving the goal of economic development.

Selection criteria can continue to focus on the likes of age, education, language skills, work experience, and whether candidates have community ties such as local education, work experience, or family.

Key to the success of the MNP will be ensuring its selection criteria is not too onerous, while at the same time ensuring the selection criteria is rigorous.

One of the risks with imposing criteria such as needing a job offer and settlement plan is to exclude for the MNP is such criteria can make it very difficult to get enough qualified candidates. In the absence of enough candidates, the MNP will not be able to achieve its goal of supporting economic development in

Companies that laid off workers due to COVID tell Bank of Canada they plan to rehire this year

Companies that have laid off workers are telling the Bank of Canada they plan to rehire some of those workers this year.

But many hiring plans remain muted over COVID-19-related uncertainty.

The bank's quarterly business outlook survey published Monday suggests many service sector and energy companies don't expect a return to pre-pandemic employment levels.

About one-third say they have used a federal wage subsidy to reduce or avoid layoffs, while other firms looking to rehire or hire new staff cited an emergency federal benefit for workers as a hurdle to their plans.

The latest figures from the federal government show the \$45-billion wage subsidy has paid nearly \$17.1 billion to 245,160 companies as of June 29. Meanwhile, the Canada Emergency Response Benefit, or CERB, has paid \$53.5 billion in benefits to 8.16 million people as of

June 28 since it was introduced in late March.

The worry among workers about losing their job rose to the highest level seen in the bank's regular survey of consumer expectations, rebounded alongside the business outlook survey.

As well, workers' expectations of how easily they could find new work dropped to the lowest level since the 2015 oil price shock.

Consumers' expectations for wage growth were below what they anticipated for inflation, while the outlook for growth in household income dropped to its lowest level in the survey's history.

Lockdowns and stay-at-home requests from governments have put the economy in a deep freeze since mid-March, with the three beginning in recent weeks as restrictions are rolled back.

The central bank's business survey detailed some of the impact.

home.

Adding to the business uncertainty is how consumers will respond as economic activity continues to restart.

The consumer survey said spending expectations have tumbled, which the bank's says suggests consumers have become more cautious due to the economic impact and health risks related to the pandemic.

The bank said consumers expect to spend mostly on essentials. They expect to spend less on durable goods like cars and furniture, as well as for services that involve face-to-face interactions like dining out, travel or going to the movies.

"Another sign of caution is that many respondents expect their work to return to normal sooner than their spending and social habits," the survey report says.

"This points to an end excess supply and disinflationary pressures."

The business outlook survey and Canadian survey of consumer expectations once ahead of the Bank of Canada's net interest rate announcement and monetary policy report on July 15.

The central bank is expected to keep its key interest rate on hold at 0.25 per cent, while the monetary policy report will include an update to its economic forecast.

Canada's economy shrank by almost 20% in March and April, but turnaround seen in May data

Canada's economy shrank by 11.6 per cent in April, the biggest plunge on record, following March's contraction of 7.5 per cent as COVID-19 lockdowns began.

Situation Canada reported Tuesday that all 20 categories the data agency tracks were lower, and they added up to the biggest monthly plunge since record-keeping began in 1961.

April's plunge means the economy at the end of April had lost almost one-fifth of the output it produced at the end of February.

Australia Cricketers Reach Compromise On Pay Row

A potential pay dispute between Cricket Australia (CA) and players was averted Saturday after the governing body withdrew a contentious projection of financial losses from the coronavirus pandemic.

The decision to "reset" negotiations follows the resignation last month of CA chief executive Kevin Roberts, with his interim replacement Nick Hockley working to repair relations between the two sides. The body in June forecast revenues would fall by nearly 50 percent in the 2020-21 financial year despite the pandemic hitting in the off-season and India's lucrative Test tour this year still set to go ahead.

Australian players, both men and women, operate under a revenue-sharing arrangement and faced a significant knock-on effect in the amount of money distributed to their payment pool, which is a fixed percentage. The Australian Cricketers Association (ACA), which represents players, rejected the forecasts as hasty and issued the governing body with a notice of dispute, which could have led to a court standoff. But CA on Saturday agreed to postpone its projections until it had a clearer idea of the financial impact of the pandemic. In turn, the ACA withdrew its notice of dispute.

"Today's agreement is a significant step forward in cricketers' response to the challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic and should provide our stakeholders with renewed clarity and confidence about the summer ahead," CA said in a statement. "Calculating revenue projections 12 months ahead during a once-in-a-century pandemic has not been without its challenges, but we believe we have arrived at a position that provides all parties with greater certainty about how to navigate the next year." ACA chief executive Alistair Nicholson said the "reset" is both welcome and sensible.

The move is seen as a common-sense approach from both sides, given the picture for the cricketing summer ahead remains unclear. So far, only two tours involving Australia have been impacted by coronavirus—a two-Test tour of Bangladesh and a limited overs visit from Zimbabwe that have both been cancelled. There is also doubt over whether Australia will be able to host the Twenty20 World Cup in October and November, but its four-Test series against India scheduled to start in December is still expected to go ahead. Officials also remain hopeful of having crowds for the popular T20 Big Bash League.

BCCI To Discuss India's Revised FTP, Domestic Cricket Season In Apex Council Meeting On July 17

The BCCI will work on finalising India's revised Future Tours Program and the domestic season when it conducts its fourth Apex Council meeting on July 17. The meeting, like the last emergency meeting on May 6, will be held online amid the COVID-19 pandemic. The nine-member Council could also discuss the raging issue of Chinese sponsorship in the IPL.

However, any matter concerning the IPL can only be officially taken up by its Governing Council, which had called for a meeting to review Chinese sponsorship in the cash-rich league in the wake of the Galwan Valley clash last month but is yet to come up with a date.

The Indian cricket team, which last played in the first week of March, was scheduled to tour Sri Lanka for a limited-overs series in June-July but that series has been postponed indefinitely due to the pandemic.

A tour of Zimbabwe in August has also been postponed for the time being.

With the cases rising rapidly in India, it is not even clear when the players can assemble for a training camp though individually, some of them have hit the nets.

Aamir Khan's Laal Singh Chaddha Won't Reach Ladakh, Due To Sino-India Clash

The ambitious story of Laal Singh Chaddha has taken actor-producer Aamir Khan and director Advait Chandan to Kolkata, Delhi, Rajasthan, Chandigarh and Amritsar so far. The unit had two major schedules pending in Ladakh and Ladakh when the nationwide lockdown brought its shoot to a grinding halt in March. Even as Khan is certain about not resuming shoot until October, the producers, along with co-producer Vinod Khosla Motion Pictures - has decided to cancel the Ladakh schedule in light of the India-China military standoff along the Galwan valley.

A source reveals, "Given the current scenario, shooting in Ladakh is out of the question. So, Aamir, Advait and the top brass at the studio are considering shifting the venue to Kargil. The final call will be taken in the coming weeks."

The film, also starring Kareena Kapoor Khan, is an official adaptation



of Tom Hanks-starrer Forrest Gump (1994). It was originally slated for a Christmas 2020 release, but has now been pushed to 2021.

In contrast to several filmmakers who are planning to go back to work, Khan has apparently informed the co-producers that he does not wish to put the cast and crew at risk by resuming shoot. "With many of Aamir's staff members testing positive for COVID-19 last week, the actor is all the more certain that he will not return to the set until the situation is under control. He also pointed out that some countries that opened up are now experiencing a second wave of the virus. Though a significant portion of the movie remains to be filmed, the creators and the studio have unanimously decided to exercise caution and hold off the shoot for now."

Ontario eyes next phase of reopening as entire province enters Stage 2

TORONTO — Ontario's minister of health says the government is considering moving into Stage 3 of the provincial reopening plan "as soon as we possibly can" while her team reviews the data on COVID-19 growth in the province.

"We are fortunate that we haven't seen any huge outbreaks and I think that's very good news," Christine Elliott said at a news conference on Monday. "We had 154 cases from yesterday, the numbers have been quite low, relatively speaking, and so it is something that we are looking to move into."

Elliott's comments come as Ontario Premier Doug Ford announced that Kingsville and Leamington, Ont., will both move into Stage 2 as of 12:01 a.m. Tuesday, the last municipalities in the province to do so.

"These communities can join the rest of the province in reopening," Ford said. "Outbreaks in the community have been contained,



Thousands of Ontario businesses on the verge of bankruptcy await Stage 3 of provincial reopening

TORONTO — Thousands of small businesses across Ontario are considering bankruptcy as they sit on the sidelines of the COVID-19 economic recovery, according to an advocate for independent business owners.

The Canadian Federation of Independent Business (CFIB) surveyed small and medium sized businesses and found that 16 per cent say they are on the verge of closing their doors permanently as a result of the pandemic-induced shut down of the economy.

"Businesses need to start making revenue again, otherwise they're just not going to survive," said Ryan Mallough, CFIB's Director of Provincial Affairs for Ontario.

Mallough said businesses such as movie theatres, gyms, fitness studios and yoga studios as well as restaurants that are restricted to

What happens in Stage 3?

Just like Stage 2, health officials may need to "reapply or tighten

"Most of these businesses have been making zero revenue for three months," Mallough said. "Even having a fantastic summer, a fantastic fall, or even a fantastic winter, you still lost a quarter of your year at near

While Premier Doug Ford has said he has been lobbied by a number of sectors to reopen the rest of the economy, his government wants to move "cautiously" and ensure that the new COVID-19 case numbers are as low as possible.

Concerts and sporting events, however, will continue to be restricted for "the foreseeable future."

Moving into the next stage would be welcome news for thousands of small businesses across Ontario, which are considering bankruptcy, according to an advocate for independent business owners.

In Stage 2, movie theatres, gyms, fitness studios and yoga studios remain largely closed, while restaurants that are restricted to patio-dining have been struggling as they wait for the province to enter the third and final stage of the economic revival plan.

However, when those businesses do reopen, they will likely look very different than what Ontarians remember.

"We still need to be very careful as we open up the economy, as we move into Stage 3," Elliott said.

The health minister noted that there are "many restaurants" already willing to make the arrangements to operate in accordance with public health requirements, including opening at reduced capacity.

"We'll get there very shortly," Ford said on Friday.

Ford said the third and final stage of the government's reopening plan would allow "most all businesses" to relaunch their operations with limits on capacity while large venues such as the Rogers Centre or the Scotiabank Arena would remain closed to spectators.

When asked for a specific timeline on stage three, however, Ford said he couldn't provide an exact date but said the government's Jobs and Recovery Committee — led by Finance Minister Rod Phillips — was examining options and plans.

"Since it's going to be the last stage we want to make sure our T's are crossed, our F's are dotted and make everyone's safe."

Ford rejected the notion that his government's slow roll out of the economic recovery has forced some businesses to declare bankruptcy and said the province is "doing everything we can" and is moving responsibly.

"You see what's happening when you move too quickly, you see what's happening south of the border. We don't want that happening up here."
