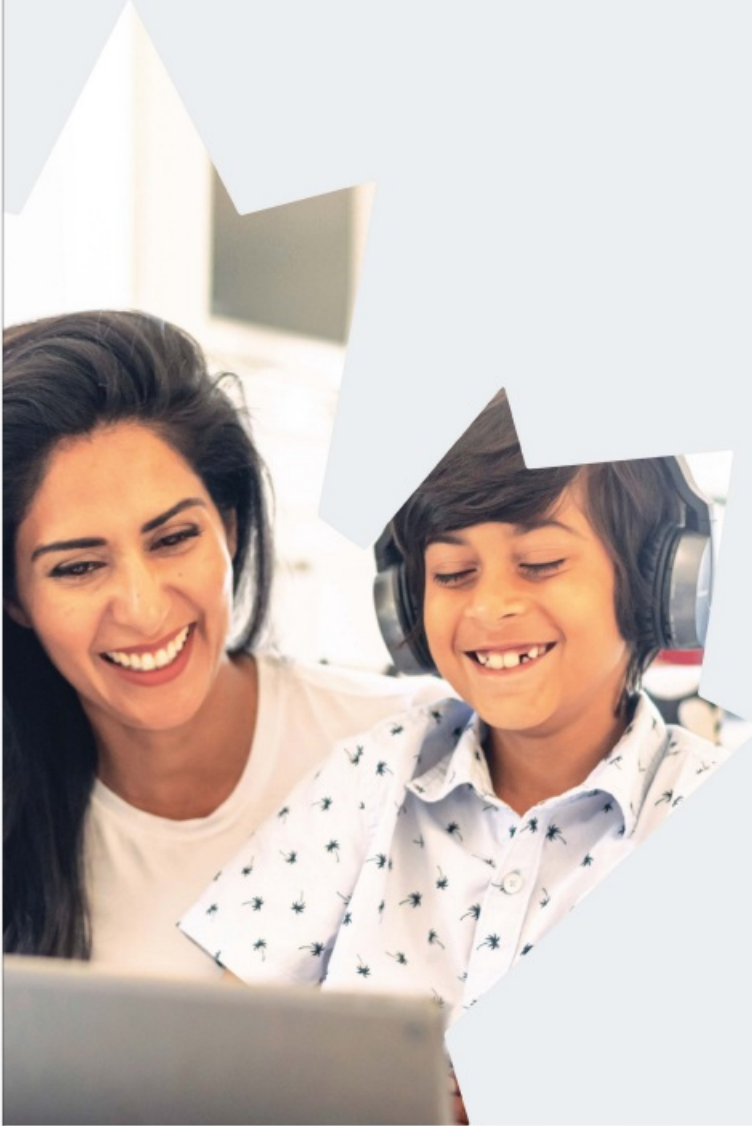

**Canada's coronavirus rent subsidy program kicks off**

Businesses struggling to pay the bills because of the COVID-19 pandemic will be able to start applying Monday for a long-awaited new commercial rent-relief program offered by the federal government.

The new Canada Emergency Rent Subsidy replaces an earlier rent-support program for businesses introduced in the spring that saw little pickup because it relied on landlords to apply for help.

The new program will cover up to 65 per cent of rent or commercial mortgage interest on a sliding scale based on revenue declines, with an extra 25 per cent available to the hardest-hit firms.

Federal cabinet ministers will highlight the program during a news conference this morning in which they will also open two initiatives designed to help businesses owned by Black Canadians.

The Canadian Federation of Independent Business, which represents thousands of small companies across the country, is welcoming the new rent program as long overdue for firms hit hard by COVID-19.

However, it is criticizing the government for not opening it to businesses that would have qualified for the previous rent-relief program, but could not access federal funds because their landlords chose not to apply.

Similarly, the Opposition Conservatives are criticizing the government for not rolling out the



program sooner, and for shortcomings in the related legislation that still need to be fixed.

The revamped program includes a requirement that entrepreneurs pay their rent before applying, putting the subsidy out of reach for many cash-strapped stores.

Finance Minister Chrystia Freeland, who is scheduled to speak around midday in Ottawa, promised the Canada Revenue Agency wouldn't enforce the requirement for any companies that apply for the assistance.

She has pledged the government will quickly introduce legislation to formalize the initiative.

"The government had all summer to come into September with draft legislation that is properly thought out to support small businesses and they blew it," said Conservative MP Pat Kelly, his party's small business

TORONTO — Any Canadian who have old paper bills in their wallets have until the end of the year to use them in day-to-day transactions before merchants no longer have to accept them.

The Bank of Canada (BoC) issued a reminder on Thursday that hundreds of millions of \$1, \$2, \$5, \$50, and \$1,000 bank notes will have their legal tender status removed as of Jan. 1, 2021.

However, the bank says the decision to remove legal tender status from these bills will have little impact on the majority of Canadians.

"Most Canadians will not be affected because the bank notes targeted by this announcement have not been produced in decades and are rarely used in transactions," the BoC said in a statement.

The BoC noted that stores can still accept these bills as payments if they so choose.

"Money is not just bank notes but comes in many different forms: credit cards, debit cards, cheques, and contactless payments using mobile devices. You can pay with any of these forms of money, even though they are not considered 'legal tender,'" the BoC said.

Ottawa opens new COVID-19 emergency rent subsidy for businesses

Statistics Canada reported last week that commercial rents rose by 0.7 per cent in the third quarter of the year, after a record 1.6 per cent plunge in the second year when the economy took a nose-dive due to COVID-19.

Rents for office buildings rose at the fastest pace, followed by industrial and then retail buildings.

The national statistics agency said the rise in commercial rents in the third quarter "reflected the gradual easing of rent relief and abatement that began in the second quarter."

**\$1, \$2 among Canadian bills set to lose legal tender status in 2021**



The \$500 bill is one of the rarer bank notes, and with just over three dozen of the bills in existence, they are extremely hard to come by. The value of one bill can range from \$20,000 to \$60,000 depending on its condition, according to the website CanadaCurry.

Other rare bank notes, such as the \$25 bill, can also fetch thousands of dollars.

CANADA'S OLD BILLS

The \$1 and the \$2 notes stopped being issued in 1989 and 1996, respectively, and were replaced with the loonie and toonie. Five versions were produced of these bills before they were taken out of circulation.

The only \$25 bills in circulation were issued as commemorative bank notes in 1935 to mark the 25th anniversary of King George V's accession to the throne. Both it and the \$500 note were discontinued shortly after they were issued in 1935.

The BoC produced four versions of the \$1,000 bill before withdrawing it in 2000.

The BoC's last count of affected bills in circulation, from the end of 2019, is as follows:

- \$1 bill: 150,230,000
- \$2 bill: 103,036,000
- \$25 bill: 1,840
- \$500 bill: 40
- \$1,000 bill: 632,019

These numbers do not include banknotes issued by the Dominion of Canada, individual provinces or de facto or chartered banks.

The removal of legal tender status of these bills is in accordance with amendments to the Bank of Canada Act and the Currency Act approved by Parliament in 2018 to remove outdated bank note denominations from circulation.

**Canadian Armed Forces commander to formally apologize to victims for sexual misconduct**

The commander of the Canadian Armed Forces is preparing to formally apologize to victims of sexual misconduct.

The apology is part of a \$900-million settlement agreement that the federal government reached with current and former military members, as well as civilian Defence Department employees, last year after a class-action lawsuit against the Forces.

Lawyer Jonathan Peak, who represented the plaintiffs, says his clients are looking forward to the apology from the chief of the defence staff as well as the Defence Department's deputy minister as soon as it is reasonable under the current circumstances with COVID-19.

Peak says the apology is important for victims of military sexual abuse to heal and have their experiences acknowledged.

The Defence Department is declining to provide details on the apology, but vice-chief of the defence staff Lt-Gen. Mike Rossos recently told The Canadian Press that it is being planned alongside a week of training for military members on sexual misconduct.

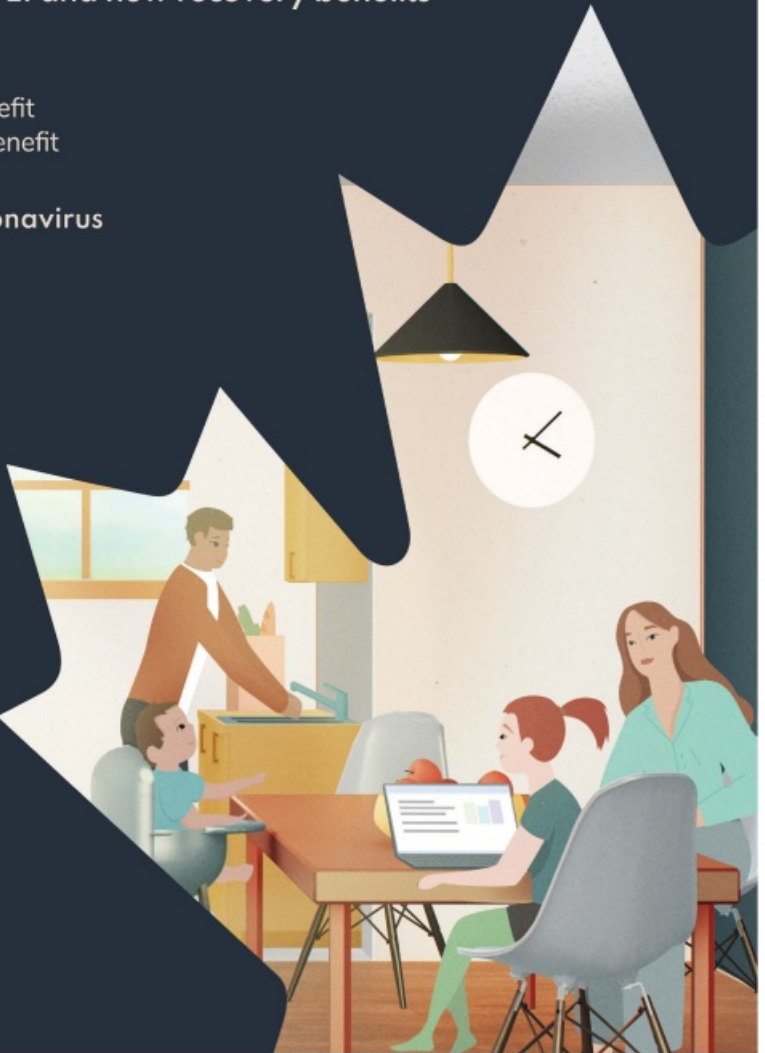

## COVID -infected flights fall sharply across Canada

Only five international and six domestic flights with passengers infected with COVID-19 landed at Canadian airports last week.

That's compared to 44 international and 60 domestic flights recorded the week previous, according to publicly available data from Health Canada.

Five of the six domestic flights occurred on Nov. 16 - Sweep 406 between Toronto and Abbotsford, PAL Airlines 1902 between Quebec City and Sept-Isles, Jazz 8290 between Vancouver and Prince Rupert, Air Canada 341 between Ottawa and Vancouver, and Air Canada 209 between Calgary and Vancouver.

The sixth flight was Air Canada 428 from Toronto to Montreal on Nov. 17.

Internationally, only two infected flights originated from the United States, both from Chicago - United 4552 to Toronto on Nov. 16 and Air Canada 7596 to Montreal on Nov. 17.

Other international flights include Air Canada 989 from Cancun to Montreal and Rouge 1904 from Mexico City to Toronto - both on Nov. 17 - and Turkish Airlines 17 from Istanbul to Toronto on Nov. 18, the only non-North American flight to carry COVID-19-positive passengers.

Calgary, home to the federal government's pilot program testing international arrivals for COVID-19, recorded no infected passengers over the past week, down from two the week previous.

Turkish Airlines has carried the most COVID-19-infected passengers of any international carrier over the past two weeks - seven to Toronto and one to Montreal.

Health Canada only posts data online from the past two weeks, and does not list how many passengers on board tested positive, only - when available - listing ranges of row numbers where the person may have sat.

Data on infectious cases from a variety of sources, states Health Canada, including contact tracing and information from local public health authorities.

## Obama calls Trump era an 'anomaly' in Canada-U.S. relations

Barack Obama says he's confident that after four turbulent years, Canada-U.S. relations will be restored to a more stable traditional course.

In an interview with CBC Radio's The Current, the former U.S. president said the Trump era is an "unprecedented anomaly in our relationship."

"What we've seen over the last few years is anomalous," Obama told The Current's host, Kelly Rowland.

"It's the honest with you. On my scale of severity, in the aftermath of the Trump administration, the relationship between the United States and Canada is not at the top of the list. I think that is one that actually can be mended relatively quickly."

"I think we've got some bigger problems, in terms of major international relations," Obama said.

In a wide-ranging interview following the release of A Promised Land, the first in his two-volume presidential memoirs, Obama remarked the U.S. management of the pandemic as one "example of the longer-term damage to his country's reputation."

"Cordial and co-operative relationship" Trump has withdrawn from the World Health Organization, the global climate accord and the Iran nuclear deal, threatened NATO, and used tariffs to punish allies.

## Coronavirus: Canada tops 330K cases ahead of new COVID-19 restrictions

Regions across Canada braced for a host of new public health restrictions on Sunday as the second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic sent case counts soaring from coast to coast.

Surgicong counts that reached record heights in several provinces over the weekend spelled the short-term end to museum and retail services in some infection hot spots, while others prepared to further cap public and private gatherings in a bid to halt the spread of the virus.

Across the country, health authorities identified a total of 4,792 new cases of the virus, with 49 more deaths. The new infections, which saw place Canada in its sixteenth day of daily-identified cases topping the 4,000 mark, bring the country's total cases to 330,201.

A total of 11,455 people have also succumbed to the virus, while at least 261,291 patients have since recovered. Over 13.7 million tests have also been administered.

In Ontario, which reported 1,534 new cases and 14 additional deaths on Sunday, shoppers flocked to local stores in Toronto and neighbouring



Peel Region a day before both districts were slated to enter the lockdown phase of the provincial pandemic response plan.

Janet Reid visited Toronto's Eaton Centre on Sunday afternoon to do some last-minute shopping in the stores before non-essential retailers close their doors to in-person visitors. She reports seeing busy scenes start as COVID-19

## Ontario reports a record number of new COVID-19 cases for second time in last three days

Ontario is reporting a record number of new cases of COVID-19 just as Toronto and Peel enter a lockdown to contain the rapid spread of the virus.

The Ministry of Health says that there were 1,589 new instances of the disease caused by the novel coronavirus confirmed on Sunday as well as another 19 deaths, 11 of which involved residents of long-term care facilities.

It is a new record case load for any single 24-hour period, just barely topping the previous high of 1,588 that was reported on Saturday. It also represents a new instance of the 1,487 new cases that were reported last Monday.

Meanwhile, the seven-day average of new cases increased again and now stands at 1,429. That, however, is still down from this point last week when it stood at 1,443.

The latest positive cases came on just 37,471 tests, repeating a trend that typically sees the province report

fewer results at the beginning of the week due to a drop off in testing over the weekend.

The positivity percentage over the last 24 hours was 4.6 per cent. It is the highest that number has been since last Tuesday.

The vast majority of the new cases do continue to be clustered in Peel (515 cases), Toronto (336 new cases) and York (205 new cases) with those three regions accounting for more than two-thirds of all new infections.

But the transmission of the virus does seem to be accelerating in communities across Ontario, as officials have warned.

On Monday there were 63 new cases reported in Waterloo, as the region officially moved into the red zone in Ontario's COVID-19 framework. There was also another 41 new cases in Durham, 53 in Halton and 61 in Hamilton.

"The main thing people can do now is please stay home," Toronto Mayor John Tory told CP24 on

social distancing, down from the previous week of 11.

The province reported 11 new COVID-19 cases on Sunday, bringing its number of active diagnoses to 44.

"I know this will not be easy, but it's an initial step to contain the community spread and avoid the potential to overwhelm our health-care system," Dr. Robert Strang, Nova Scotia's chief medical officer of health, said in a Friday statement outlining the measures.

In Newfoundland and Labrador, which reported three new cases on Sunday, Memorial University announced plans to postpone staff members' scheduled return to work, originally set for the coming week.

The small town of Deer Lake, N.L., also sounded the alarm over a regional spike in cases when it announced a two-week closure of some municipal buildings and asked local businesses to follow suit.

The slow of pending restrictions is in line with advice from Canada's top public health officer, Dr. Theresa Tam, who on Sunday urged people to limit gatherings and only go out for essentials ahead of the holiday season.

Tam said Canada is seeing "rapid epidemic growth," as the country has now recorded 330,492 confirmed cases of COVID-19 since the pandemic began.

Over the last seven days this average of 19 COVID-19 patients have died each day, up slightly from this time last week when the seven-day average was 18.

If there is reason for optimism, it comes in the form of encouraging news on the vaccine development front.

On Monday morning AstraZeneca reported that its vaccine appeared to be up to 90 per cent effective in late-stage trials. Moderna Inc. and Pfizer have also reported that their vaccines are more than 90 per cent effective with the latter having recently applied for emergency use authorization from U.S. officials.

"With these vaccine studies it is great news and it is always OK to take a step along the way and smell the roses and have a small celebration but we have to stay the course," infectious diseases expert Dr. Isaac Bogoch told CP24 on Monday, prior to the release of the latest numbers.

"Our masks, our distancing, our hand sanitization, getting vaccinated for the flu. Just continue to adhere to those public health measures and it is clear that things are going to get better and better and better but we are not there yet. So just double down, hold the fort, continue to practice our public health measures and we will be back. We really will."
