## Ontario will not be changing public health measures amid discovery of first Omicron variant cases

TORONTO — Ontario's top doctor said he wouldn't be surprised to discover more cases of the Omicron variant but doesn't see the province implementing further public health measures at this time.

Chief Medical Officer of Health Dr. Kieran Moore made the comments at a news conference on Monday morning, less than 24 hours after confirming two positive cases of the B.1.1.529 COVID-19 variant, which was first detected in southern Africa.



The cases were found in two people from Ottawa who had returned from a trip to Nigeria through an airport in Montreal.

They are the first cases of the Omicron variant identified in Canada.

Moore added that four other possible cases exist in two people from Ottawa and two from the Hamilton area, however they are still waiting for the results of genome sequencing.

"We are investigating other cases as I wouldn't be surprised if we find more in Ontario," Moore told reporters.

Moore said he does not foresee Ontario taking any steps back in its reopening plan at this time.

"If we see widespread presence of Omicron across Ontario, which is not the case at present, then we could review any measures that we need to take at a provincial level," Moore said, adding that he doesn't have a "crystal ball."

"If it's a less lethal virus, less impact on the hospital sector, and our vaccines can continue to work against

it, we will continue our current strategy and not have to have any further public health restrictions."

There are also 375 people who have returned to the province in the last two weeks from the seven southern African countries under a federal travel ban, Moore said. The countries include South Africa, Mozambique, Namibia, Zimbabwe, Botswana, Lesotho and Eswatini.

Moore said that local public health units are reaching out to those individuals to ensure they get a COVID-19 test.

The province has extended eligibility for free COVID-19 PCR testing for individuals who returned from these locations between Nov. 1 and Dec. 6.

The variant was first detected on Nov. 24 in a specimen collected on Nov. 9, according to the World Health Organization (WHO) who have since labeled B.1.1.529 as a variant of concern.

There are two confirmed cases of the omicron variant of the coronavirus in Ottawa, the Ontario government announced Sunday.

"Today, the province of Ontario has confirmed two cases of the omicron variant of COVID-19 in Ottawa, both of which were reported in individuals with recent travel from Nigeria," Ottawa Public Health is conducting case and contact management and the patients are in isolation," the statement said.

These are the first cases of the omicron variant confirmed in Canada, coming just days after the country implemented new travel restrictions on foreign nationals who had visited several countries in southern Africa over the preceding two weeks.

Those travel restrictions went into effect on Friday. The omicron variant was first identified by South African researchers and has provoked global concern.

Little is known about the new variant, dubbed omicron by the World Health Organization and labeled as a variant of concern. It is being linked to a rapid rise of cases in a South African province.

It is not known at this time whether the variant is more transmissible, or more dangerous to the health of those who are infected by it, than other coronavirus variants.

"The best defense against the omicron variant is stopping it at our border. In addition to the measures recently announced, we continue to urge the federal government to take the necessary steps to mandate point-of-arrival testing for all travellers irrespective of where they're coming from to further protect against

the spread of this new variant," said the statement from Ontario Health Minister Christine Elliott and Dr. Kieran Moore, the province's chief medical officer of health.

The provincial government urged residents to get vaccinated, including with booster doses, and to continue following public health guidance.

"Ontario is prepared and ready to respond to this new variant."

More confirmed cases likely: health minister



In a statement released Sunday, federal Health Minister Jean-Yves Duclos said the confirmation of two omicron cases is a signal that the country's monitoring system is working but to expect more cases of the variant.

"As the monitoring and testing continues with provinces and territories, it is expected that other cases of this variant will be found in Canada," Duclos said.

"I know that this new variant may seem concerning," he added, but said existing vaccines and public health measures were helping to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

In a separate statement, the Public Health Agency of Canada said border measures could change as the situation develops.

"The Government of Canada will continue to assess the evolving situation and adjust border measures

as required," it said.

"Better to be safe than sorry"

Reacting to the news, epidemiologist Dr. Christopher Labos emphasized the lack of information the world has so far about the omicron variant, noting that some other variants failed to take hold and out-compete the dominant strain.

"While it's important not to under-react, it's important not to over-react. We don't have a lot of information about whether this variant is actually more dangerous than the variants that we've dealt with," he said in an interview on CBC News Network.

Still, he said it was "better to be safe than sorry" and take precautions. But he said that until there was more information, it was not necessary to radically change behaviour, so long as

you are vaccinated and otherwise acting in accordance with public health guidance.

"The stuff that worked before should work now."

WHO urges countries to keep borders open

The World Health Organization (WHO) released a statement on Sunday summarizing what it knows about the variant. It said it is studying whether the variant is more transmissible than those currently spreading, such as delta, as well as whether omicron increases the risk of reinfection, as suggested by "preliminary evidence."

The idea of travel bans in response to new variants has long been criticized by some as an ineffective measure of stopping the spread of the virus. South Africa has said the travel

measures are "unjustified."

Dr. Matabidiso Moeti, WHO's regional director for Africa, said instituting travel bans targeted at southern Africa "attacks global solidarity."

"COVID-19 constantly exploits our divisions. We will only get the better of the virus if we work together for solutions," Moeti said.

In an interview on Rosemary Barton Live that aired prior to the government announcement on Sunday, WHO special adviser Dr. Peter Singer said it "wouldn't be a surprise" if the variant was in Canada.

He said the United Nations agency believes travel restrictions should be "risk-based and time-limited," part of a comprehensive package, rather than the only measure taken to mitigate the risk of a new variant.

"They're definitely not a silver bullet," he said. Singer argued the international community should not create situations that disincentivize countries from being transparent about new variants.

Singer said the most important things Canadians can do to protect themselves are the same as they have been throughout the COVID-19 pandemic: get vaccinated and follow public health measures.

"This is a call for individuals to raise their guard. There are things individuals can do which help with any variant or any version of this virus, including omicron."

He urged Canada and other countries to redouble their efforts to provide resources to the global vaccination campaign, saying that's the best way to stop the spread of omicron and potential future variants.

## How will \$10-per-day child care impact Canada's immigrants?

In April 2021, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau outlined the goal of daycare costing an average of \$10 per day across the country within the next five years.

In pursuit of this goal, the federal government has committed to investing \$10 billion over the next five years and then a minimum of \$9.2 billion annually after that. The Prime Minister's office stated the new system could reduce daycare fees by 50 per cent on average over where outside of Quebec by the end of 2022. Since the announcement, the federal government has entered into deals with provinces and territories about implementing this new early learning and child care system. So far, it has reached agreements with seven provinces and one territory. Part of the agreements entail determining how much money the federal government will provide each jurisdiction to make child care more affordable, accessible, and to support child care providers themselves through the likes of skills training and wage increases.

The rationale behind this initiative



is to spur economic growth and social prosperity across the country.

Upon making the announcement, the Prime Minister's office explained, "By building an early learning and child care system, we will make life more affordable for Canadian families, create new jobs, grow the middle class, increase women's participation in the work force, and drive strong economic growth across the country."

How might \$10-per-day child care impact immigrants? This policy is likely to be a huge win for parents across Canada and perhaps most so for parents facing vulnerable circumstances. Immigrants are among those most likely to benefit them.

Immigrants tend to arrive to Canada at a younger age than the average Canadian age. This means they tend to have younger families and access to affordable child care is of utmost importance. Unlike the average Canadian, immigrants may not have existing family and friends available to care for their kids, and may not yet have high enough income to be able to afford daycare. It is usually immigrant women that bear the brunt of this.

One of the reasons newcomer women may struggle to integrate economically and socially in Canada is a lack of affordable daycare options. For instance, in Toronto, which is the leading destination of new

immigrants to Canada, the average monthly toddler fees is \$1,600 according to the federal government's Budget 2021. That is over \$3,000 a month for the typical family with two kids.

In the absence of affordable options, newcomer women may be forced to stay at home to look after their kids. This hinders their ability to pursue their Canadian careers in earnest as well as build the social networks which are also vital to feeling at home in Canada. It comes as no surprise that research feeling isolated in their early years of landing in Canada in large part due to their child care responsibilities.

Hence, it is highly probable that the rollout of the \$10-per-day child care program will enable more immigrant women to pursue their careers. This would improve the purchasing power of immigrant families since they can expect more income to come in while seeing their daycare costs decrease. The program should also improve social integration among immigrant women (since the workplace is also key to building social networks), and represent a boon for a Canadian labour market that is set to see all of its 9 million baby boomers reach retirement age over the next decade.

Loh said, "So you see a greater willingness to act, to take the vaccine where there can be success."

Dr. Hashim Khan, the co-chair of the Canadian Muslim COVID-19 Task Force, says Muslim doctors and imams came together to discuss the impact the virus would have not just on Muslims in Peel, but across Canada.

"We know our communities had a lot of risk factors like multi-generational homes, essential work, lower levels of health literacy that would contribute to the spread of the virus," Khan said.

"We wanted to clear misconceptions." The Brampton Islamic Centre was one of the mosques that offered testing and vaccine clinics through the Canadian Muslim COVID-19 Task Force and Peel Public Health.

"We already having conversations about how to roll out again for kids," Khan said, referring to vaccinations for children aged five to 11.

In November of last year, when daily cases in Brampton were at their highest, Dr. Raj Grewal co-founded the South Asian COVID-19 Task Force with other physicians to combat not only misinformation but also false perceptions.

## Sure, there's Oxford, but growing number of U.K. students are choosing Canadian universities

As a product of Britain's elite private school system, Sophie Boehler was groomed to pursue the prestige of an Oxford or Cambridge education.

When she was unsuccessful at getting in, instead of choosing another U.K. school, the 20-year-old from London looked further abroad to Montreal's McGill University.

In hindsight, she said, it was the best place she could have wound up.

"I wanted to use university as a springboard to trying out different things, and that was just something I didn't see as an option in the U.K.," Boehler said, noting it might not have been possible to get the course combinations she was looking for.

"The more I looked at it, the more I wanted an adventure and a completely new system, and Canada seemed so cool."

Boehler is part of a growing trend of U.K. students choosing to study at Canadian universities, driven by low fees, a variety of courses and degree combinations, and more flexibility. At the same time, admissions to the U.K.'s elite universities have become more competitive as they open their doors to more students from public schools.

The U.K. has always been a popular destination for Canadian students, but now, the tide is starting to flow both ways. Figures from both Universities Canada and the Canadian government show that after just creeping upward for a few years, in 2019, the number of new students from the U.K. at Canadian universities rose by nearly 10 per cent, to almost 2,500.

The number may appear modest alongside the tens of thousands of students accepted from India and China, but the rise in enrolment from the U.K. nonetheless represents a breakthrough for the Canadian system.

Perception has changed. Just over a decade ago, Canada was barely on the radar for British students contemplating a path to academic success. But those who help facilitate study abroad on both sides of the Atlantic say the interest in



Canadian universities of late has been extraordinary.

"There has been serious growth," said Anthony Nemecok, an education advisor based in London who is hired by students and U.K. secondary schools to provide them with information on university opportunities abroad.

He said there's been a significant change in the way British students and teachers think about a foreign degree. The British consider their own schools - which are often ranked among the most prestigious in the world - to be top tier, and the idea of going abroad for an education wasn't seen as especially beneficial. In addition, many U.K. undergraduate programs are three years, compared to four in Canada.

"When I would contact some schools and say, 'I'm available to give a talk about U.S. and Canadian higher education,' they would slam the phone down," said Nemecok.

More flexibility, less hassle. Nemecok said more Brits are discovering that Canadian universities can offer greater flexibility than many U.K. schools.

There's also a more streamlined application process compared to the U.S., said Ramiz Guliyev, 18, who is studying French and economics in his first year at the University of Toronto.

Guliyev, who attended a private boarding school outside of London, wanted an Ivy League degree and was accepted at Cornell University in Ithaca, N.Y. But the pandemic meant he was provisionally admitted based on his grades but asked to defer admission so he could take the SAT, the standardized scholastic assessment

test required of all students who apply to U.S. schools.

He didn't want to waste a year, so he chose the University of Toronto instead.

Boehler's friend, Harry North, 20, said flexibility is why he decided to take a chance on Canada, too.

North, who is from Cobham, just outside London, took a "gap year" in 2019 after getting rejected from Oxford and spent it, in part, skiing in British Columbia. There, he discovered there was a way to study both economics and computer science, without having to choose between the two.

After the gap year, he applied and got into the University of Waterloo, a top-ranked U.K. school, but decided to return to Canada to attend McGill instead.

"The irony is now, since coming to Canada and McGill and doing both [subjects] I wanted to do, I'm much happier than if I got into Oxford and didn't take a gap year," he said.

Emerging market. A spokesperson with Universities Canada, which represents post-secondary institutions, said Canada is trying to build its brand in more markets. The High Commission of Canada in the U.K. even has a senior trade official dedicated to education.

Marc LeBlanc, senior government and international relations officer with Universities Canada, said the U.K. is one of the top foreign markets for Canadian students looking to study abroad but Canada wants to even out the flow of students between the two nations.

"As the number of Canadian students in the U.K. increases, we're seeing an increase in the number of U.K. students coming to Canada as well," he said.

And though American Ivy League universities are after the same crop of kids, he said, Canada has the advantage of lower fees. Tuition fees for an undergraduate arts degree in Canada for a foreign student can vary from \$29,000 per year at McGill to nearly \$42,000 at University of British Columbia. But in the U.S., tuition can cost \$60,000 Cdn or more at top schools.

Meanwhile, fees in the U.K. for domestic students have steadily increased over the last decade, with undergraduate tuition now costing approximately \$9,000 GBP, or \$17,000 Cdn. It used to be almost free 20 years ago.

## How Brampton went from a COVID-19 hotspot to one of Canada's most vaccinated communities

After a dark period last year as a nationwide COVID-19 hotspot, Brampton and Peel Region have emerged as one of the most vaccinated communities in the country.

As of Friday, 86 per cent of residents 12 and older in Peel Region are fully vaccinated, and 90 per cent of residents 12 and older have had a first shot. The region now sees an average of 40 cases per day. This time last year, that number was more than 10 times higher.

"I think that speaks to how our community has stepped up," said Peel Chief Medical Officer Dr. Lawrence Loh.

He says the way a diverse region facing critical language and social barriers came together to get shots into arms is a major story.

"It's been a whole community effort that's actually made the difference in

getting our large vaccination rates," he told CBC News.

While that effort started with public health staff working 24/7, and municipal, regional, and provincial governments mandating masks and vaccine certificates, Loh says, it also involved a collaboration between Peel Public Health and local groups like India Community Services, Punjabi Community Health Services, Roots Community Services, and many more.

"Community groups were 'indispensable'." Other organizations, like the Canadian Muslim COVID-19 Task Force, the South Asian COVID-19 Task Force, the Latin American COVID-19 Task Force and the Black Health Task Force, informed their respective communities about the virus, testing and vaccinations in

languages that residents spoke, from sources they trusted.

"They were indefatigable... They were going door-to-door setting up bookings and transportation networks to get people to go to clinics, working with us to set up mobile clinics," Loh said.

"That was actually really a big secret to our success," he added. The groups helped remove what Loh describes as "hard barriers," like finding time off work, or getting to a clinic, or speaking to a doctor or nurse in a familiar language. He says once those barriers were removed, vaccinations increased.

"Many new Canadians, racialized populations have connections to places where other vaccine-preventable diseases are fairly prevalent... They have a healthy respect for the science and effectiveness behind vaccines,"

# India A face South Africa A in unofficial Test amid threat of new Covid-19 variant Omicron

Coooped up in a bio-bubble while a new COVID-19 variant causes panic all across here, the India A cricket team will take on South Africa A in the second unofficial Test from Tuesday with some senior side aspirants hoping to make an impression. The first four-day game ended in a draw due to inclement weather on Friday last week even as the detection of the B.1.1.529 COVID-19 variant, which was named Omicron by the WHO, forced many countries to impose international travel restrictions on South Africa.

The uncertain situation also led to the Netherlands abandoning their last two ODIs against South Africa which were scheduled at Johannesburg. However, India A have stayed put in Bloemfontein in a bio-bubble.

The matches are being played without spectators and India senior team is also due to arrive in the country by December 9 for a nearly seven-week assignment starting December 17. If the situation deteriorates, it can jeopardise the tour which involves three Tests, three ODIs and four T20s across four venues - Johannesburg, Centurion, Paarl, and Cape Town.

However, the India A players will need to keep the thoughts of the new variant at bay and focus on the task at hand as they revive their battle with South Africa A here. In the first game, India A batters produced a good show with Abhimanyu Easwaran hitting a solid hundred and skipper Priyank Panchal scoring 96 to take them to 308 for 4 in response to South Africa's 509 declared when rain washed out the final day.

Opener Prithvi Shaw also scored a fine 48 and he would look to make the most of the good batting conditions here. Hanuma Vihari, who was not picked for the two home Tests against New Zealand, could manage just 25 here and would be eager to make up for it in the second game.

However, the visiting team's bowling is an area of concern as it allowed the hosts to pile up a mountain of runs at Mangaung Oval. While Navdeep Saini, who has lost his place in the Indian team, and his pace partner Arun Nagwansalkar took two wickets each, Umran Malik, who was picked in the A squad after impressing with his extra pace in the IPL, also snapped one. Among the three spinners, Rahul Chahar, who was a part of the recent home T20 series against New Zealand, conceded 125 runs for his one wicket, while K Gowtham and Babu Aparajith failed to cause any damage.

# Pak vs Ban: Abid Ali, Abdullah Shafique unbeaten as visitors 109-0 at stumps

Pakistan reached 109-0 in their second innings at stumps on the fourth day chasing a target of 202 in their first Test against Bangladesh in Chittagong on Monday.

Both openers Abid Ali (56) and Abdullah Shafique (53) completed their fifty as the visitors came within 93 runs of victory after bowling out the hosts for 157 earlier in the day.

Earlier, the visitors were 38-0 at stumps with Abid Ali hitting on 20 along with Shafique (18) after Shabaz Afridi's 5-32 helped them restrict the Tigers in the second innings earlier in the day.

Returning on 39-4, Bangladesh looked down and out once they lost Mushfiqur Rahim in the first over of the day, before Litton - who struck a hundred in the first innings - hauled the hosts back to respectability with 59 off 89 balls.

Afridi trapped Litton leg-before and then had Abu Jeyed out for a duck to complete his fourth five-wicket Test haul, before off-spinner Sajid Khan, who finished with 3-33, wrapped things up by dispatching Tajul Islam.

The hosts had got off to a positive start with Mushfiqur hitting a boundary off the first ball of the morning, bowled by Hasan Ali.

But two balls later he left the wrong delivery and departed for 16 after Hasan struck off stumps.

Duo-jointed overnight batsman Yasir Ali-to prevent further collapse.

Just when they looked ready to prosper, Afridi's low bounce hit the helmet of Yasir, who retired hurt after making 36.

Litton survived on 26 when he was given out, caught at short leg off Sajid Khan. The replay showed that the ball only hit his pad and was going down the leg.

Sajid was rewarded for his persistence as he trapped Mehidy Hasan leg before for 11.

Substitute Nurul Hasan replaced Yasir after Mehidy's dismissal and barely survived a strong caught-behind appeal just before lunch.

Nurul heaved one at long-on to Faheem Ashraf off Sajid after the break, getting dismissed for 15, and Pakistan took little time to take the remaining wickets.

Bangladesh have failed to defeat Pakistan in any of their 10 previous encounters.
