So many Canadian fighters in Ukraine, they have their own battalion, source says

The International Legion for the Territorial Defence of Ukraine says the 550 would-be fighters from Canada are based in Kyiv

So many citizens of Canada have shown up in Ukraine to fight for the country's new foreign legion, the organization has set up a separate Canadian battalion, says a Ukrainian government source.

The news is more evidence of a historic movement by people here to join the armed forces of another nation, and potentially risk their lives in combat against Russian invaders.

The 550 would-be fighters that have arrived from Canada so far are part of a battalion based in Kyiv, said the representative of the International Legion for the Territorial Defence of Ukraine, who asked not to be identified for security reasons.

It is called simply the Canadian Ukrainian Brigade and has its own arm patch, featuring a maple leaf with a trident - Ukraine's national symbol - superimposed on top.

"Intentional legion volunteers are usually kept together for logistics purposes as it is easier for communication, to avoid language barriers," he said.

Meanwhile, a Ukrainian-Canadian activist helping in the recruitment of fighters in this country said hundreds more have volunteered to fight in Ukraine.



Boys Wresnewsky, a former Liberal MP who is helping Ukrainian diplomats organize volunteers for the International Legion, said his rough estimate is that at least 1,000 Canadians have applied to join the force.

Canadians can sign up for the official Ukrainian government program through the website defencukraine.ca or by contacting the embassy and consulates directly, but Wresnewsky said many are simply "picking up and going" to Ukraine via Poland.

"What is so heartfelt is that we have so many Canadian ex-military who are stepping forward and understand that this is just so fundamentally wrong," he said about the response to Russia's invasion. "They by nature are protectors and ... they are willing to step forward, travel to Ukraine."

"They also are aware this isn't just the battle for the freedom and

cash in the face of soaring gas prices. Gas prices continue to hit record levels across the country and Canadians are feeling the pinch.

Whether it's making the switch to public transit or buying a bike, people are willing to do whatever it takes to save on fuel costs.

Prices in British Columbia and the Northwest Territories have already topped the \$2 mark with other provinces such as Ontario and Quebec closely following suit, according to Gasbuddy.

Around the middle of last month, the national average sat at \$1.56 per litre, according to the Canadian Automobile Association.

Now, it sits over 20 cents higher at \$1.78 per litre.

Across the country, more and more Canadians are replacing their daily drive with public transit as gas prices soar.

MetroLink, a Crown government agency responsible for operating GO Transit, UP Express and PRESTO, had a two per cent increase in ridership during the first week of March, around the same time when gas prices hit record highs.

"For the last several weeks, our staff have been extremely pleased to welcome back more familiar faces," a spokesperson for MetroLink told Global News. "Customers have told us they are coming back right now because of the high cost of gas."

According to 2021 data from the Canadian Urban Transit Association (CUTA), when gasoline prices rise by 10 per cent, transit ridership increases by 1.44 per cent.

Although it will take a prolonged period of time to see how much of an impact gas prices will have on transit, Jamey Heath, CUTA's director of

communications, said, "Anecdotally, we are being told that ridership has increased and future increases seem likely."

For Metro Vancouver's largest transportation network, Translink, a two per cent increase has been seen this month so far, a spokesperson said.

In Toronto too, gas prices may help boost ridership levels on the TTC.

"With the price of fuel now at record highs, transit will certainly become a more attractive alternative to driving," Stuart Green, the commission's media relations spokesperson told Global News.

Compared to pre-pandemic levels, ridership currently sits at 51 per cent. The TTC is forecasting approximately 85 per cent by the end of 2023.

However, the transit service is yet to make a forecast on when exactly ridership will hit pre-pandemic levels.

In 2019, before the pandemic began, 1,691,000 fares were collected each average business day. In 2020, the year the pandemic began, this number dropped to 900,000 to 712,000.

"It is possible that fuel prices could accelerate the return of ridership, but for the time being, we have not made any forecasts about when we would see ridership reach pre-pandemic levels," Green said.

Rising gas prices are also going to impact people relying on shared rides as Uber introduced a temporary "fuel surcharge" starting March 16. There will be a \$0.50 surcharge on every ride and a \$0.35 surcharge on every Uber Eats delivery.

As gas prices in the province creep closer to \$1.70 per litre, Vello's manager,



The extra fee will go to the driver and delivery, the company said, noting the surcharge will be in effect for at least 60 days.

In Halifax, some cabs are now charging over a dollar per fare fuel surcharge, Global News reported last week.

Upickinbicyclesales Bike shops in Canada, like Winnipeg's Woodcock Cycle, have already started experiencing an early spring rush as gas prices soar.

"Our season usually doesn't kick off quite this early," Jon Carson, manager at the shop, told Global News Winnipeg. "A lot of people are mentioning that gas prices are actually driving them to the store," he said.

Winnipeg bike shop seeing uptick in bike demand and rising fuel prices In New Brunswick, locally-owned bike shop Vello has been constantly busy.

Gas-and-dash Police and small retailers are also preparing for an increase in "gas-and-dash" thefts as gasoline prices rise.

A spokesman for the Ontario Association of Chiefs of Police said it has started hearing from the retail industry about concerns related to theft.

"There's a national suspicion that some people may resort to (theft)," Joe Couto, the association's director of communications, said.

"People's budgets are really being pressed these days ... I would not be surprised if some people, out of desperation or otherwise, resorted to this type of behaviour," Couto said.

"These are difficult times for Canadians as a whole."

The group has been working with the Ontario Convenience Stores Association, which represents 7,500 retailers, to lobby the provincial government for legislation that requires people to prepay - similar to what is in place in British Columbia and Alberta.

"That would really prevent a lot of the gas-and-dash," said Couto.

"Primarily for us it's an issue of the safety of the folks who work at gas stations, but for our police services it represents a significant cost to not only respond but to investigate."

The Convenience Industry Council of Canada also said high gas prices have already spurred an increase in gas-and-dash thefts. The council noted many stores are still trying to recover financially from the COVID-19 pandemic and argues provincial governments must be doing more to help footloose.

"These are global issues that we have little control over and I think it's probably going to get worse before it gets better," said Anne Kothawala, president of the council.

Patrick Brown joins race to lead Conservative Party of Canada

BRAMPTON, Ont. - Patrick Brown has officially joined the race to lead the federal Conservatives, with a promise to heal the fractures that have erupted in the party over recent years.

Brown, 43, launched his campaign in Brampton, Ont., where he has served as mayor since 2014.

He walked on stage at the Queen's Manor Event Centre with his wife, Genevieve, and their two children Sunday as the crowd chanted his name.

Brown's speech pitched a campaign that offers a greater voice for caucus members and a bigger Conservative tent.

"I want people who have never voted Conservative, and voted for other parties to feel welcome in our family," Brown told the crowd Sunday.

Brown, known within the party as a hardworking organizer, is the fifth candidate to enter the Conservative leadership race, already populated by former federal Progressive Conservative leader Jean Charest and Ottawa-area MP Pierre Poilievre.

Rookie Ontario MP Leslyn Lewis and Independent Ontario MPP Roman Baber are also running.

Brown's political roots run deep in Brampton, and it's a part of the country where Conservatives know they need to grow their support if they hope to form government.

He promised to do that without sacrificing seats in western or rural Canada, and suggested the party needs to stop treating Conservative members in the west "like an ATM and start delivering election victories."

In his speech, Brown addressed the main concern raised about his candidacy by party membership: his support for carbon pricing during his time as leader of the Progressive Conservatives in Ontario.

Many party members reject carbon pricing as an ineffective "tax," including Polivievre, who has vowed to repeal the federal carbon price and attacked Brown over his support of the policy.

Just before Brown announced his leadership candidacy, Polivievre's team

launched an attack ad with the tag line "Patrick Brown will say and do anything," pointing out his inconsistent position on environmental policy.

"Fast attempts by conservative parties in Canada to address climate change, including one that I led, haven't been done with consultation with our membership or caucus," he said.

"Trust me from experience, I can definitely admit that is not the right approach."

He said, if elected leader, the party would decide on its environmental policy collectively.

"I'm confident that together we can come up with a winning position, one that addresses climate change and respects provincial jurisdictions, energy security, energy sector workers, while keeping life affordable," he said.

Brown recently wrote a letter asking Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister Chrystia Freeland to forgo a planned increase for April 1,

citing the price of gas and other affordability issues.

Brown also made a pitch to rebuild trust with Canada's "cultural communities," a voter base who call the country's largest cities and suburbs home and whose support Conservatives must win over if they hope to win the next election.

Brown's speech tested his opposition to Quebec's Bill 21, a controversial secularism law in that province that prohibits public servants in positions of authority from wearing religious symbols on the job.

As Brampton's mayor, Brown spearheaded a plan for cities to pledge money to help fund a legal challenge to the law.

He also condemned the Conservatives' promises for a barbed wire cultural practices hotline and a night ban during the 2015 election as an attempt to stifle religious freedoms and normalize intolerance. Those policies were the reason Conservatives lost that race against Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, he said.

Brown's turbulent political career has been defined by its ups and downs.

Rising tuition, student debt weigh heavily on post-secondary students

Facing ever-rising tuition as well as higher prices for food, housing, and other necessities, post-secondary students in Canada are concerned about the debts that loom after graduation.

Five students told CBC News about their costs of living and the financial pressures weighing them down.

Nicolas Avendano, Toronto

Program: Architectural technology, Centennial College

Tuition: \$8,000-9,300/term | Housing: \$1,000/month | Food: \$300-350/month | Transportation: \$100-150/month | Books: \$250/year | Internet: \$40/month | Phone: \$60/month

Nicolas Avendano tries to live as frugally as possible.

The 28-year-old shares a downtown Toronto basement apartment with a roommate. Brown lives with his parents, who own a restaurant and a bar. He works at home after shopping for sales at the supermarket. His parents, living in the U.S., help him with tuition and housing, but he also works a fast-food job to help cover the bills.

Yet the Colombian-born international student faces tougher decisions these days. Pay for public transit or walk? Start eating smaller breakfasts or perhaps small meals altogether?

"There are times when I just say, 'Maybe I won't go out, because I don't have money for that,'" noted the college student.

Avendano believes post-secondary tuition should be more affordable, especially in face of other costs rising so substantially - in order to be accessible to more students.

Education "shouldn't just be a thing that you can access because you have the money or the economic standing in order to achieve," he said. "I think that's definitely one of the reasons why society is becoming so stratified between the rich and the poor."

Nor should students be forced to live in total deprivation, he added.

"There's a lot of criticism against young people for wasting to lead full, meaningful lives instead of just working and studying every single day, non-stop."

Dane Monkman, Winnipeg
Program: Indigenous politics and governance, University of Manitoba

In Winnipeg, 26-year-old Dane Monkman is a graduate student advocating for lower tuition rates. In the 2018-2019 school year, University of Manitoba students saw a tuition hike of 6.6 per cent. For three consecutive years afterward, students saw annual increases of 3.75 per cent.

"During the pandemic we're seeing an increase in tuition every year," Monkman said. "That's obviously coming at a time where things are getting worse - and a lot of the time that causes a barrier for students to access post-secondary education."

Monkman, who is a member of Peguis First Nation, knows he is lucky to have his tuition and textbooks funded by his band. He also shares his off-campus living costs with his partner, but he recognizes other students may not have those kind of financial supports.

Monkman maintains that those in positions of power are making decisions regarding tuition that minimize the chances of lower-income students ever reaching those positions themselves.

"They essentially are kicking away a ladder that will prevent further students from getting into these sort of same jobs or those same positions of power to make decisions."

Monkman has family members who have chosen not to pursue a higher education due to the financial strain it would place on themselves and their families. Some are just out of high school and unable to fulfill attending university due to the cost, he said.

"That's really unfortunate because it should be a right for everyone."

Yasmin Gardy, Burnaby, B.C.
Program: Food and technology, British Columbia Institute of Technology

For students who live in B.C., pressures like rent and food are huge financial concerns.

Yasmin Gardy, 33, chose to live in the Edmonds neighbourhood in the city of Burnaby due to its proximity to campus. With rent as high as \$1,700 per month for housing, she took out loans to pay for both her tuition and living expenses.

"I reached out to receive some financial support from the Jewish community here in Vancouver," said Gardy.

Gardy, who emigrated to Canada alone 10 years ago from Israel, turned to the Hebrew Free Loan Association of Vancouver. It's helping her stay afloat in her last term before graduation.

As for food, another major financial constraint, Gardy again turned to her community for support. This past January, she registered for the food bank for the first time after things became difficult. She now regularly makes an appointment to pick up the basics such as bread, eggs, cheese and vegetables.

The number of international students studying in Canada has risen for years, representing nearly one-fifth of university enrolments until just before the pandemic, according to Statistics Canada.

Yet most don't truly understand just how expensive school is for international students, says visual arts student Gayathri Murugan - including those domestic classmates sitting next to her at Memorial University.

That the 22-year-old pays so much more to sit in the same classes came as a surprise to them, said the fourth-year student, who took out a loan in India to pay for her studies in Canada and works several part-time jobs and volunteers on campus.

Many don't know international students can only work a maximum of 20 hours per week during school, she pointed out, or that they're explicitly excluded from opportunities such as Canada Summer Jobs, a federal program matching students with summer work experiences.

"I really feel like international students are treated like cash cows and it's just not very fair to us because we are also trying to get an education," said Murugan, who's hoping to find work in Newfoundland's arts sector upon graduation.

"It's so hard to get out of university and just start your life with so much debt already."

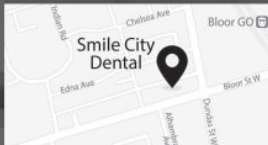

On this, Jacqueline continued, "Very, very easily, it can turn you into a horrible person, a bitter person. Someone who is upset with the way that people behave, one can become

untrustworthy. Don't let it change you, don't let it turn you, don't let it upset you, don't let it steal your light. Stay good, stay positive."

Jacqueline reiterates how a lot of statements have been made on social media without giving her the chance of clarifying it. She emphasizes how such violation of privacy often makes you start questioning everything, however, it is important to stay put and not let it control you.
